




5. Training programme for new faculties on ERP and online class management - 28.08.2020


6. Online Orientation programme for the new 2020 batch of students - 01.09.2020 & 02.09.2020


9. International Level Webinar on the Next Generation Statistician's & Future Trends - 16.10.2020


10. Faculty Development Programme (FDP) on Franciscan way of approach to holistic education - 19.12.2020

Dr. Roopa Vasudevan shared the vision for Higher Education in India – 2020 with a focus on three main elements i.e. Students enrolling in the Higher Education System Holistic and Multidisciplinary Education and Educational Technology, and Online Education. She also shed light on the current state of the Learning Crisis, which gave way to the creation of this new structure i.e., it replaced the 10+2 with 4+3+3+2+3. The substantial impetus placed on vocational education or hands-on learning in the new policy will give rise to multiple hybrid jobs.



With the rapid progression of information technology, and to be able to offer the students a much broader, multidisciplinary foundation, she expressed the importance of using a holistic and multidisciplinary learning approach which will help the learners adapt and reinvent themselves to the demands of the new hybrid work culture and dynamic socio-cultural changes. She highlighted the National Educational Technology Forum which provides independent evidence-based advice, builds institutional and intellectual capacities, envisions strategic thrust, articulate new directions, and also research. Dr. Viraj Kumar from Disha Bharat concluded the session by emphasizing the challenges faced in accessing online and offline content. Around 700 participants from various educational institutions across the nation participated in this webinar. The programme ended by the Vote of thanks.

The workshop was inaugurated by the college management, principal and along with the virtual presence of honourable chief guest Dr. Muthuraman, Head of Bio Medical Statistics and multimodal Single Processing Unit, Department of Neurology, Johannes Gutenberg



University Mainz, Germany. The principal welcomed the virtual audience and the director delivered the presidential address.

Dr. Muthuraman was taken over the first session. He was an eminent speaker in the field of Research for about a decade, introduced the concept of Research to the audience with a purpose of building a strong foundation within aspiring researchers. All the day's events were successful and the participants had the wonderful learning sessions from the resource person.




13. Webinar on Unique and Futuristic careers for students after 12th - 08.05.2021




14. Webinar on mind control due to covid -19 - 26.05.2021
